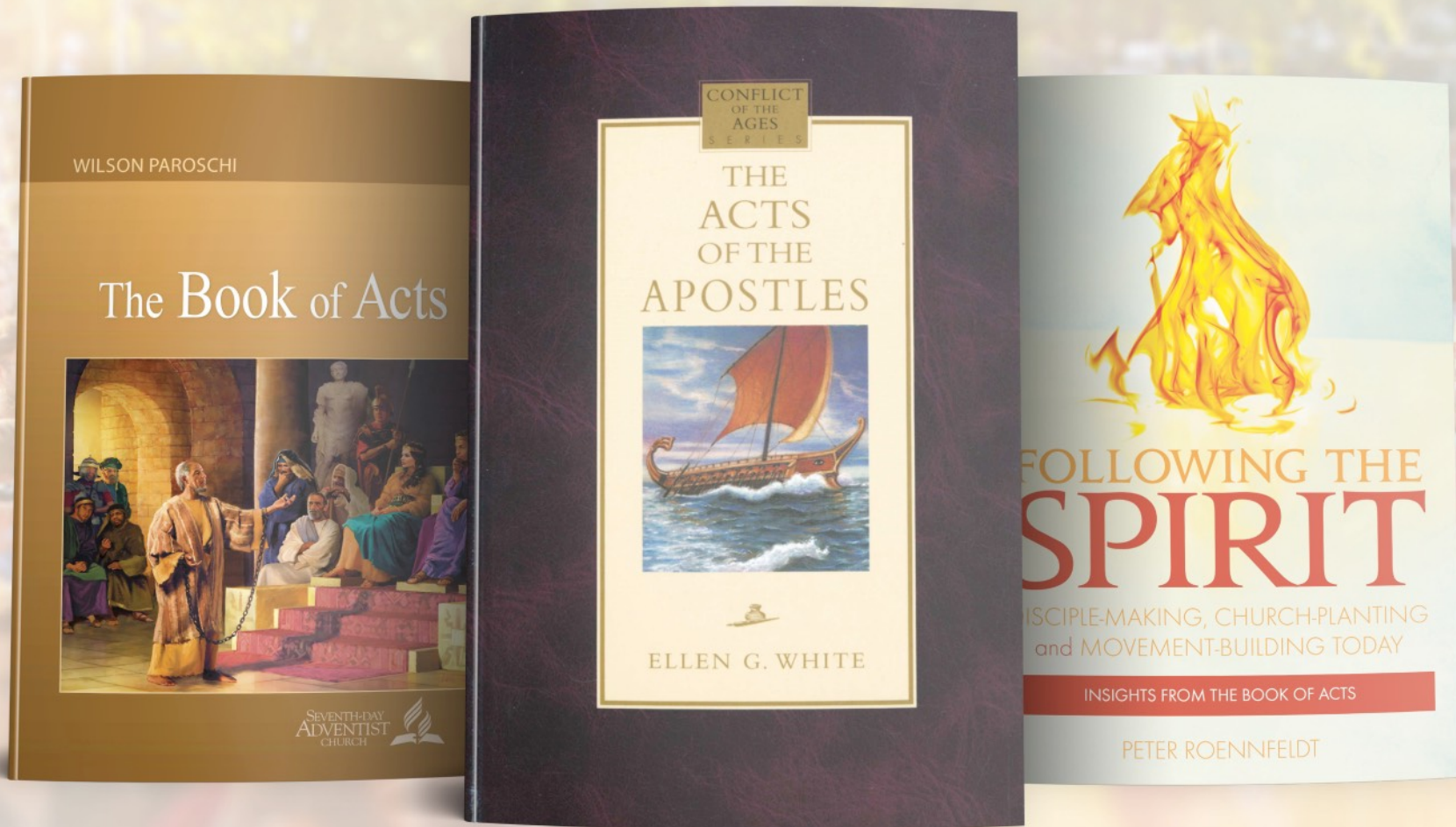


Journey to Rome
