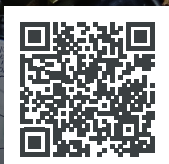

REGISTRATION INFORMATION



REGISTRATION

Registration will be between the hours of 8:00am – 2:00pm on January 8th, 2019.

In order to minimise long queues, we will be allocating "arrival times" for registration upon arrival at the Camporee site. If you require a specific registration time, please email your request to edwinadavis@adventist.org.nz



AGE RESTRICTION

The minimum age of any attendee who is in a Pathfinder Club is 10 years of age.

Please note that Pathfinders are eligible to attend if they have turned 10 years of age by the first day of the Illuminé Camporee, January 8, 2019. Underage children cannot be at Camporee. You will have to make other arrangements for their care. Please do not embarrass yourself or us by disregarding this requirement. We appreciate your cooperation on this matter.



DE-REGISTRATION / DEPARTURE

Departure from the Camporee site will commence on Sunday morning the 13th January 2019 no earlier than 7:00am. All clubs must leave the grounds before 2:00pm.





ARRIVAL PROCESS AT CAMPOREE

Please do not arrive at registration before your allocated time. Security will not let anyone on site until they are registered in their allocated time slot on Tuesday, January 8.

As you travel to the Camporee, your accommodation arrangements should be planned so that you do not stay on the Camporee grounds until the day it commences – 8 January 2019.

As you will appreciate, there is a tremendous amount of planning to be done beforehand. Our Camporee staff will only have a short time in which to prepare the Camporee site, build the stage, bring in the toilet facilities, set up the activities and prepare the many other functions for the Camporee. We need as much time as possible without anyone being on the site.

We will only register full clubs, not individuals. If any club members intend to arrive separately, they will need to make prior arrangements to meet up with the club before registration.

The Club Director or person in charge should be in the first vehicle of your convoy if travelling in a number of cars or coaches.

When you arrive at the Camporee site:

ONLY THE CLUB DIRECTOR OR PERSON IN CHARGE SHOULD GO TO THE REGISTRATION PERSONNEL

NOTICES FOR CLUB LEADERS

The Camporee will operate on a sub-camp system. Each sub-camp will consist of clubs from various Conferences/Missions. This will enable you to meet Pathfinders from all over the Union.

Each sub-camp will have a Director and a Chaplain. Club Leaders will be responsible to their Sub-camp Directors.

EVERYONE MUST WEAR THEIR WRIST BAND AT ALL TIMES.

To help the sub-camp Directors communicate with individual Pathfinder clubs within their sub-camp, we ask each club to bring a small whiteboard and whiteboard marker which is to be positioned in their club meeting area.



CAMPOREE LOCATION

The physical address for the Camporee site (which does come up on Google maps etc.) is:

The Camporee site is about an hour from Christchurch airport and just under 30mins from Rangiora.

There will be signage to direct you to the specific area allocated for the Camporee.





CAMPOREE OPENING & CLOSING

Clubs will be allocated registration times between 8:00am and 2:00pm on Tuesday the 8th January 2019. The Illuminé Pathfinder Camporee will officially start with the Opening Ceremony at 4:00pm on Tuesday January 8, 2019. It will conclude after the closing ceremony on Saturday night, January 12, 2019. Departure from the Camporee site will commence on Sunday morning the 13th January 2019 no earlier than 7:00am. All clubs must leave the grounds before 2:00pm.



CLOSED EVENT

After the Opening Ceremony and Parade, which parents or friends may attend, the Camporee will be a **CLOSED EVENT**. Only those who have registered and paid will be permitted on site during the Camporee. No one will be permitted to leave the Camporee site with the exception of medical emergencies and cooks with their assistant(s). This is for your safety and to maintain the special atmosphere of the Camporee. Security will ensure that this rule is adhered to for the smooth-running of the event and your safety.

Clubs must plan so they can be self-sufficient for all their needs during the Camporee. The site is in a rural area on a farm with no nearby facilities. Bread, milk and ice will be available at the café on a daily basis.



VISITORS / PARENTS

Some clubs will be accompanied by parents or helpers who are assisting with the transport of Pathfinders but not staying for Camporee. We are mindful that many of these parents, helpers and guests wish to stay and witness the opening ceremony. This is welcomed as the opening ceremony is open for all to attend, but kindly ask all visitors to exit the site immediately after the program.



ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Please be aware that there is no access to electricity while at Camporee.

Therefore, recharging will be impossible. If you choose to bring electronic devices such as iPods, iPads, tablets, laptops and mobile phones, it is at your own risk.



CANCELLATION POLICY

No refunds will be given for application cancellations. The only exception would be for those who have been denied visas of entry into New Zealand, or for non-attendance due to a death in the immediate family. All requests must be accompanied with supporting documentation.



CAMPOREE HIGHLIGHTS

A **daily video** will be produced featuring the best photos and video clips from the day's activities. This short highlight video will only be used during the Camporee for evening worships. This video will not be shared publicly.

Please contact Vaihira Kei at VahiraKei@adventist.org.nz if you do not wish for your child to be photographed or videoed.

An **overall highlights video** will be available online after the Camporee. This will only feature Pathfinders whose parents are at Camporee and have given written permission for their child to be featured.



CELLPHONE RECEPTION

Please note that Spark and Skinny users will get some coverage at the Camporee site.

There is very limited or no coverage for Vodafone and 2 Degrees users.

CAMPING + SITE RULES



WHAT PATHFINDERS SHOULD BRING

Pathfinders will need:

- + Bible
- + Pathfinder Passport (if you have one)
- + Pen or pencil
- + Plate, cup, cutlery, tea towel
- + Basic first aid kit
- + Toiletries (biodegradable soap, toothbrush, toothpaste etc.)
- + 2 or more towels
- + Sleeping bag and/or sheet and warm blanket
- + Lilo/air mattress and/or sleeping mat
- + Pillow
- + Sun hat & sun cream
- + Torch & spare batteries
- + Insect repellent
- + Water bottle
- + Buddy Club Honour Workbook (if involved)
- + Personal medication

Clothing

- + Pathfinder dress uniform
- + Field uniform
- + Older clothes for wet/muddy activities
- + Jacket, jersey (it can be cold & windy at night)
- + Wet weather gear in case of rain (raincoat/poncho, gumboots)
- + Swimmers/togs - (girls-one piece and shorts or T-shirts and shorts)
- + Woollen socks
- + Sandshoes/sneakers (that can get muddy)
- + Sandals for water activities
- + Dress shoes (for Pathfinder dress uniform)
- + Long trousers/pants: when packing please include 1-2 pairs of long trousers/pants for protection against gorse. Material that is thick such as denim, thick/drill cotton or light canvas is recommended.

IN ADDITION

Please bring a pleasant happy spirit and a desire to meet new people, challenge yourself and grow closer to God.



TOILETS

Port-a-loos will be provided, and sewage removed by a commercial contractor during the course of the Camporee. However, all sub-camps will be responsible for regular cleaning.



SHOWERS

Showers will not be provided for Pathfinder Clubs.

Clubs will need to provide their own showers and fill them from the river (there is no water line they can tap into for showers – only water for drinking and cleaning). There is a swimming spot in the river close to sub camps 1 & 2.



WATER USAGE

Drinking water will be provided in each sub-camp for the clubs. Please note this is for drinking, cooking and food related washing (e.g. dishes). For all other purposes not related to food and cooking, please use water from the river. You will need a water container to fill up from the supply area in your sub-camp.



CLUB PACKING LIST

All Pathfinder Clubs need to be self-sufficient. You need to bring for the following in addition to any other items you require:

- + Tents (sleeping & cooking)
- + Enough food for your club for 5+ days
- + Cooking gear: gas cookers, pots, utensils (**remember gas or fire cylinders are not allowed on planes**)
- + Buckets & fire blanket for fire safety
- + Wash up basin and bio-degradable detergents
- + First aid kit
- + Camp furniture (minimal)
- + Plastic garbage bags for all club refuse (place rubbish in bags, then in skip bins)
- + Ground sheet/mat for night programs
- + Solar showers (showers are not supplied)
- + Pathfinder club flag and flag stand



CLUB AREA WITHIN THE SUB-CAMP

Tent spacing within your club area has been relaxed, so there is now no legal minimum required spacing between campers' tents. This means there should be more free space within your allocated club area. The same ratios apply as per Newsletter 2.

Sites will be allocated as below:

- + Under 20 Pathfinders:
15 metres x 17 metres (approx.)
- + 20 - 25 Pathfinders:
15 metres x 25 metres (approx.)
- + 25 - 50 Pathfinders:
25 metres x 25 metres (approx.)
- + 50 - 75 Pathfinders:
30 metres x 30 metres (approx.)
- + 75+ Pathfinders:
30 metres x 40 metres (approx.)



FIRE + COOKING

Each club is responsible for its own food supplies and meal preparation for the club. It is important you make adequate food storage arrangements.

It is necessary to emphasize that NO OPEN FIRES are permitted.

All clubs will need to bring gas cookers or similar cooking facilities. Due to the time of year there will be a total fire ban, so the normal regulations will apply. Gas refilling will be available from the town of Rangiora, but it is imperative that gas bottle owners adhere strictly to the 10-year inspection regulations. As experienced campers, we know you will take every precaution with respect to the use of gas cookers and lighting etc. No trenches are to be dug in the ground. We need to leave the grassed areas of the campground as we find them on arrival.

NO GAS REFUELLING ON SITE.

It takes 25 mins to get to a local gas refuelling place in Rangiora. See the Administration Staff for a Day Pass.



GENERATORS

Generators will have curfews at 10pm. Clubs will be camping in very close proximity to each other, so please respect your neighbours by being aware of noise and fumes from generators.



RUBBISH DISPOSAL

Please provide your own plastic garbage bags for rubbish. After the rubbish is bagged, place your rubbish bags in the commercial bins located in a designated area. Rubbish will be removed as necessary from the site by service vehicles.

SAFETY INFORMATION

PROHIBITED ON SITE



No one under 10 years old



No Laser pens



No open fires



No alcohol, smoking or drugs



No pets



No bicycles



SUNSCREEN

The sun in Canterbury is harsh and burn times are short. It is possible to get burnt after only spending 10 minutes outside.

Sunburn is uncomfortable and can damage your skin. Even those with dark skin will burn easily. A hat and sunglasses are essential. Each sub-camp will have a supply of sunscreen, but you may also want a personal supply in addition to this.



BE PREPARED FOR HOT & COLD WEATHER

Although the days may be hot, the nights could be cold, and the Canterbury area is known for its strong winds. Ensure you have warm, windproof and waterproof clothing to keep you protected.



HYDRATION

Drinking enough water will be important and water bottles are essential.



INSECTS

Insect Repellent for sand flies.

At night the insects feast on anything that so much as looks like a Pathfinder! Each sub-camp will have a supply of insect repellent, but you may also want a personal supply in addition to this to ensure your comfort and health. Local advice recommends the Bushman brand as being particularly effective against sand flies.



FOOTWEAR

Please bring a pair of sandals or sneakers for activities.

Please note that jandals / thongs / flip-flops and bare feet are considered unsafe by the Committee and are therefore inappropriate at the Camporee.



FIRST AID

Each club will have to provide their own first aid kits.



SHADED AREAS

All clubs need to be prepared to bring sufficient shade cover for their eating/meeting areas.



CAMPOREE STORE CAFÉ



CAFÉ ILLUMINÉ

Cold drinks, ice creams and snacks will be available from the café. Open hours will be outside of activities and worships. The café will also have bread, milk and ice available for club cooks to purchase.

All purchases must be paid for with cash in New Zealand dollars.

Thick shakes - The café will feature a special menu item only during lunchtimes – the Camporee drama team will be in the café making thick shakes. A wide variety of flavours will be available to go along with your milk, soy or almond/coconut base. Come along, meet the team and get an amazing thick shake!



SHUTTLE FOR CLUB COOKS

We are no longer offering an option to pre-order bread, milk, produce and ice to be delivered to the Camporee. Instead a daily shuttle for Wednesday, Thursday and Friday is available at 1:30pm for camp cooks to go to a supermarket in nearby Rangiora to purchase groceries. A sign-up sheet will be available at registration for cooks to book their seat. This service is only available to club cooks and one extra adult helper from each club.

The shuttle fee is \$15 for New Zealand clubs and \$5 for Mission clubs. The fee must be paid on the day with cash in New Zealand dollars (you can get cash out at the supermarket).

SPECIAL NOTE

An option is also available for a shuttle run on the first Tuesday afternoon of Camporee if needed – please contact Olivia Tooley at olivia.tooley@gmail.com if you would like to inquire or book in this shuttle run on the first day of Camporee.

NOTE

There will be a few basic items available for purchase from Cafe Illumine - bread, milk and ice.



MARCHING CONTEST



MARCHING CONTEST RULES

Following the success of the marching display/contests at previous camporees, it has been decided to include such an activity as part of the programme of the upcoming camporee.

Each team will consist of a minimum of six (6) club members, with points being awarded for participation from your club. The more the better! Team members will be of Pathfinder age (i.e. Friend to Guide). The team will not include Junior Counsellors or club staff; however, one staff member may act as Parade Marshall. Bonus points will be allocated if the team is led by a person under eighteen (18) years of age.

At the command of your selected club Parade Marshall, you have five (5) minutes to demonstrate the following listed commands. They may be in any order of your choosing. In your segment you may demonstrate these commands either formally or freestyle:

The competition will take place on Friday afternoon. The overall Camporee winner will receive the Camporee trophy. If your local Conference has a marching competition, we also invite them to award the winner from their Conference their own trophy (for example the Api Memorial Marching Cup for the best North Island club). The local Conference is responsible for providing their own trophy.

SCORING

Scoring will best be based primarily on execution of each command in a crisp manner, and on participation. Cadence, cautionaries and executives in instruction and delivery will be noted. All movements must be conducted within the boundaries of the parade area. Points for creativity are only 5%. If you do everything well, you will score well.

While encouraging creativity, the organisers would remind team leaders that it is a marching contest and therefore callisthenics, aerobics and dancing **CANNOT** be accepted as part of the contest. Sensual movements and gyrations or Greek Stepping are considered inappropriate and will result in the loss of points.

Clubs can join together if they want. The Dimensions of marching field are 30m x 30m.

COMPLEMENTARY ITEMS

Backpack / bag, attendance patch, camporee pin, program / booklet all pathfinders and leaders will receive this at registration.



SPD LONG SERVICE AWARD

The NZPUC & SPD Team will launch Long Service Award. This award will be a uniform/hat pin for Pathfinder and Adventurer leaders who have served as; Director, Deputy Director, Secretary, Treasurer, Chaplain, Class Teacher, Specialist or District Director, Area Coordinator, or Regional Coordinator at Conference, Union or Division level for not less than 10 years.

If you believe you are eligible, please fill out the form of this bulletin and get your local Youth Director to endorse your service record. Bring this form to the Camporee where you will need to present it to Camporee Administration by Wednesday 9th January 2019 to register for the award.





CLUB PENNANT

All attending clubs will receive a club pennant as a souvenir of the event.



PATHFINDER 'PASSPORT' STAMP

We will have an Illuminé Camporee stamp to commemorate this event. If you use a Pathfinder Passport, then bring it along to add this stamp to your collection.

INFO FOR OVERSEAS CLUBS



TRAVEL + MEDICAL INSURANCE

All international staff and Pathfinders should include appropriate travel and medical insurance, when making travel bookings. Cancellation or loss of airline ticket/passport and the cost of medical treatment is expensive in New Zealand.



BUDDY CLUB HONOURS

For those who are involved in the Buddy Club Honour, please remember that you need to bring your workbooks with you. Workbooks will need to be completed at Camporee, along with the relevant requirements, and handed in for assessment. Patches will be handed to the clubs towards the end of the Camporee.



LUGGAGE

Due to weight restrictions on the plane, please limit luggage to small or medium bag/case. Check with your airline regarding weight allowance. You will be able to take a small handbag on the plane with you. Do not bring large suitcases as there may also be limited space in your tents.



VISA

If you require a visa to travel to New Zealand, please contact your local Youth Department to request an official Letter of Invitation.



DEVOTIONALS, WORSHIP, PRAYER TENT



WORSHIP CONTRIBUTIONS

One of the best parts of Camporee is experiencing and sharing music and testimony in worship. All special items will be coordinated through the Mission/Conference leader. Here are the worship spaces where your Mission or Conference might be able to share music or testimony:

MORNING SUB-CAMP WORSHIPS

Every morning begins with worship in your sub-camps. This is a great space for your club (or joined clubs) to share a song or testimony. Please see your sub-camp director to organise this.

EVENING WORSHIPS

Every night we come together and will be part of an amazing worship that features our guest speaker, Rome Uli, praise and worship, drama, fun icebreakers, and a contribution from a Mission or Conference. Each Mission/Conference has been given one evening to organise one song and one 3-minute testimony from a young person. This will be coordinated by the Mission/Conference leader and liaised through our Programming Director, Sarah-Jane Riley.

- + **Tuesday Evening** – South NZ Conference
- + **Wednesday Evening** – New Caledonia Mission
- + **Thursday Evening** – Cook Islands Mission
- + **Friday Evening** – French Polynesia Mission
- + **Sabbath Evening** – North NZ Conference



WORSHIP SEATING

For your own comfort please bring a ground sheet, camping chair or mat to sit on for worship times.



PLA / MG INVESTITURE

Investiture commissioning info and forms – this will also happen during the afternoon program on Sabbath.



SABBATH PROGRAM

Drinking enough water will be important and water bottles will be a worthwhile item to

bring along:

- + **Sabbath School** – done in clubs (each club given a pack that includes decision cards)
- + **Sabbath Afternoon Program** – Sabbath afternoon features a very special baptism and sharing time. Part of the sharing time will be cultural items to celebrate all the cultures represented in our Union. Dale Hokin is coordinating this worship program and will be liaising through Mission/Conference leaders for items for the cultural sharing portion of this program.



BAPTISM

On occasion, Pathfinders or staff may desire to be baptised at a special event such as a Camporee. This is understandable, especially if whole families are in attendance. Approval of families and the local church pastor must be obtained before the Camporee.

Pathfinder baptismal candidates should be prepared for baptism by their local entity, following the local process and working with the pastor, families etc. Each Club Director should communicate with their Conference Director if any Pathfinders are ready for baptism by the end of November.

If a Pathfinder's desire to be baptised becomes evident during Camporee, then their decision will be noted and acknowledged at the time. Also, their name will be passed on to the local entity for follow up. In addition, an acknowledgement certificate will be given to the Pathfinder as a memento of their choice.

Working with the local entities process for baptism preparation allows for consultation & involvement with & by the people who know and are close to the children as well as not only affirming the decision but also the discipleship aspect of follow up after baptism.

TRANSPORTATION + PARKING



PARKING + CARAVANS

Car and bus parking will be situated in clearly marked areas on the Camporee site.

No vehicles are allowed in your club camping area once the Camporee starts.

Clubs using caravans and cooking trailers can have these as part of their site setup.

The area will only be patrolled at night and we take no responsibility for vehicles or their contents.



AIRPORT TRANSFER

We have received your bus transport applications and are currently putting together a timetable for when you will be collected. More information will be sent out soon to Club Directors in the confirmation letter.

The transport you have booked is ONLY for:

- + Getting your club from either the airport OR Pascoe Park to the Camporee site on Tuesday 8 January.
- + Returning your club from the Camporee site to Pascoe Park OR the airport on Sunday 13 January.

Any transport requirements outside of this must be booked directly by Pathfinder Clubs (e.g. you need to arrange your own transport to your accommodation if you arrive on January 7). Here is some information on transport providers available in Christchurch: We have been in negotiation with Clarks Coaches and they have kindly offered a cost between \$12-\$15 per person, one way for airport transfers to Pascoe Park or locally within Christchurch. MEDICAL



MEDICAL CENTER SERVICE

We have an experienced team of doctors, emergency specialists and nurses who are volunteering to run our Medical Centre. A copy each person's health record as supplied in the application forms will be accessible to them. Each activity will also be attended by a qualified first aider where necessary. Local community medical services have been notified of the Camporee. It is the Club Director's responsibility to report any medical emergency / illness / incident that has occurred during travels to Camporee. This should be reported to the medical Centre immediately upon arrival at the Camporee. This includes diarrhoea, fevers, respiratory infection, malaria etc.

We remind all Pathfinders and staff that our medical centre is for the treatment of Camporee emergencies only and not for pre-existing medical conditions.



IMMUNISATIONS

We encourage all attending Camporee to be up-to-date with their immunisations.



GENERAL HEALTH GUIDELINES

All clubs are encouraged to wash their hands prior to eating. We strongly recommend that clubs have supplies of hand sanitizing liquid (e.g.: Purell or Dettol Instant Hand Sanitizer).



SECURITY / DISCIPLINARY



SUPERVISION

It is essential that Pathfinders are always supervised while on site.

Pathfinders are to be with their Club Counsellors at all times. This means meals, parades, evening program, and other activities. Please outline to your Counsellors that they have the very important work of caring for each of their club members' social, physical and spiritual wellbeing during this Camporee.

MAIN ENTRANCE

Security will be posted at the main gate and will patrol the Camporee site day and night.



CAMPOREE DISCIPLINARY PROCESS

Most disciplinary issues will be cared for by club or sub-camp staff. In extreme cases the Camporee Director will take the matter to the Camporee Disciplinary Committee.

The Camporee disciplinary process aims to confine the issue to the club area. In some cases, this could mean that the person found responsible is confined to the club camping area and excluded from activities for a period of time. In extreme cases an individual may be asked to leave the Camporee site. A management plan has been put in place to facilitate this process.



ONE RULE FOR ALL

Only registered attendees can stay on the Camporee grounds after the opening ceremony. As we have said before, all children must be ten or older and registered with their pathfinder club. Adults must be registered with a Club or as Camporee Staff. This applies to families of both clubs and staff / volunteers.
